Minutes of the meeting in Christ Church, Chorleywood at 8.10pm on Thursday 8th October 2009

Item 1 Welcome, apologies, and opening prayers

Gavin welcomed everyone for coming - in particular new members David Baverstock, Mary Kingsley, and John Parsons - and opened synod with a prayer.

Item 2. Minutes of deanery synod on 8th June 2009 (distributed on 12th June)

These were approved (proposer: Miriam Muga; seconder Jeannie Poulton), and signed as a true record.

Item 3. Matters arising

- (Item 4). Discussion on Deanery Strategy is deferred until the next synod.
- (Item 8d). King's Langley parish moved into Hemel Deanery on 1st October, joining the benefice of Langelei.
- (Item 8e). The new vicar of St Andrew's is David White, Holy Trinity, St Austell, Cornwall, who will move to Chorleywood in February and will be inducted on 23rd March.

Item 4. Any other business

- John Galloway, the only nominee, will represent the deanery on the Diocesan Board of Finance.
- With the transfer out of King's Langley, the deanery will require a website manager to replace Rus Downham. Alex called for volunteers to contact him. *[Secretary's note: the transfer will also mean that the deanery's PtO clergy will require a person to represent them on the synod to replace Stephen Flood, who resides in King's Langley.]*
- Alex announced that Nick Alexander, our diocesan link, will be leaving that position at the end of the calendar year. On behalf of synod, he thanked Nick for all his valuable work for the deanery. The earliest date for the announcement of his successor would be following the meeting of the Diocesan Pastoral and Mission Committee in February.
- Gavin announced that he had been invited by Bishop Alan to be an honorary Canon of the cathedral. Synod enthusiastically acclaimed his honour, which he will receive on Saturday 7th November during a special Evensong at 4.00pm. Anyone may attend.

Item 5. Dates of next deanery event and next synod

Thursday 12th November (St Oswald's) - Dr Bridget Adams of the Kingdom Business School in Watford, will speak on aspects of workplace ministry; she has 25 years experience of the subject. Open to all.

Tuesday 2nd February (St Mary's) - Bishop Alan Smith will address synod at the end of a tour of the deanery.

Item 6. A Fresh Expressions (FE) presentation by the Revd Tom Gillum of St Jude's Community, South Kensington

Gavin introduced Tom, from the Community of St Jude in London SW10, which he set up in 2005 to focus on discipling with a daily rhythm of prayer, and living close to those on the edges of life. He described how God's Spirit was on the move via new types of church.

FEs - whose role was to help with training and resources - have three characteristics: a strong missionary focus; a willingness to reimagine Church from the perspective of the outside world; and a commitment to existing and new forms of Church.

Why do FEs matter? They embrace a change in patterns of Sunday worship, offering Church at different times; they embrace a change in relationships to incorporate different networks; they embrace change from a single culture to accommodate different cultures; they embrace a knowledge of faith appropriate for beginners; they satisfy a deeper spiritual hunger for explorers.

FEs are part of God's call to mission, a response to the decline of Christendom. They are aimed at the dechurched and those unchurched who are 'open'. They reflect a new way of thinking mission, from a 'go and then come' approach to 'go and then stay'. An FE is a form of Church for our changing culture, established primarily for the benefit of people who are not yet members of any church. An FE is based on the principles of listening and service ie incarnational mission. An FE has the potential to become a mature expression of Church.

Tom referred to FE initiatives in churches in the Deanery of Rickmansworth, of which some examples are given below, taken from a letter Alex had sent to Tom earlier ('MSC' = Mission Shaped Community).
